Qualified applicants are those who have completed treatment or those in treatment and their siblings. 2024 awards will be announced on or about June 1, 2024, however, the payment will be made directly to the institution of higher learning or trade school prior to the start of the recipient's academic year.

### **Eligibility Requirements**

- Keeping local funds local! Must be a U.S. Citizen and reside in either Bradford, Tioga or Sullivan County, PA.
- Pediatric cancer patient, past or present or sibling of a past or present patient of pediatric cancer who is a current High School senior and is planning on attending post-secondary education of any kind, is eligible to apply.
- High school transcript.
- ACT or SAT results if required by your college for acceptance.
- Confirmation of college enrollment in a US accredited undergraduate institution or technical trade school.
- Approximate tuition of above institution, provided on institution's letterhead.
- Letter from your healthcare provider confirming your cancer diagnosis or that of your sibling.
- Two letters of recommendation from non-family members.
- 250-500 word essay describing what you want the scholarship committee to know about you, your plans for post-secondary study and beyond.
- Virtual interview with #KCFCA scholarship committee for finalists.
- Preferred, but not required, experience advocating or volunteering for childhood cancer causes
- If selected, agree to allow Kids Can't Fight Cancer Alone, Inc. to share your name and picture both in print and on social media accounts.
